The Power of the Resurrection

Greek Terms:

Verbs: Égeíro – raise, raise up (Matt. 28:6; Mark 16:6; Luke 24:6)

Ånístēmi – raise, stand up, come back to life (Acts 2:24; 3:26; Galatians 1:1)

Noun: Ánástasis - Resurrection

The Power of the Resurrection is the power of the Triune God (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) working in unison.

The Father raised the Son (Acts 2:24; 1 Cor. 15:15)

The Son raised Himself (John 10:14-18)

The Spirit raised the Son (Romans 1:4)

The Power that raised
Jesus from the dead is
the same power that
dwells in every Christian.

(Ephesians 1:18-21; Gal. 4:6)

The power of the Resurrection is distinct from all other miraculous powers in that it is the Power of the Holy Spirit.

The Power of the Resurrection is: Light (Matt. 5:14; Eph. 5:8; Ph. 2:15)

Matthew 5:14 (NASB)

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden;

Ephesians 5:8 (NASB) for you were formerly darkness, but now you are Light in the Lord; walk as children of Light

Philippians 2:15 (NASB) so that you will prove yourselves to be blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you appear as lights in the world,

Romans 8:2 (NASB)

For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.

Galatians 5:1 (NASB)

It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery.

Galatians 5:13 (NASB)

For you were called to freedom, brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.

The Power of the Resurrection is:

Peace (Rom. 5:1; Eph. 2:14; Ph. 4:7)

Romans 5:1 (NASB)

Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,

Ephesians 2:14 (NASB)

For He Himself is our peace, who made both groups into one and broke down the barrier of the dividing wall,

Philippians 4:7 (NASB)

And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

The Power of the Resurrection is:

Life (Jn. 3:16; 17:3; Rom. 6:7-11)

John 3:16 (NASB)

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.

John 17:3 (NASB)

"This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.

Romans 6:7-11 (NASB)

for he who has died is freed from sin. 8 Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, 9 knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him. 10 For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God. 11 Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus.
