WHAT SORT OF MAN IS THIS? He came from heaven and was born in a donkey's stable. He is God, but He became a servant. Multitudes followed Him and were blessed by His words. Many were prepared to leave their businesses and abandon their families to follow Him, even when they did not know much about Him. Those who followed Him were ready to die for His cause. Under frequent mistreatment, He refused to retaliate. He had no cravings for fame. He did not commit any sin, yet He took on Himself the sins of the world.
