THE WRONG PERSPECTIVE

TO DESPISE THE KINDNESS OF GOD IS TO PRESUME THAT IT IS THE BASIS FOR A PERSON TO ESCAPE GOD'S JUDGMENT.

LIFE TRUTH:

GOD'S KINDNESS IS NOT A TOKEN THAT WE WILL ESCAPE HIS JUDGMENT BUT THAT WE MAY TURN FROM EVIL AND TURN TO GOD.

REPENTANCE

A reorientation of one's whole life and personality, which includes the adoption of a new ethical line of conduct, a forsaking of sin and turning to righteousness. (Alan Richardson, A Theological Word Book of the Bible)

THE RIGHT PERSPECTIVE

GOD'S KINDNESS IS EVIDENCED BY EXTREME EAGERNESS TO SAVE HUMANS FROM CONDEMNATION.

⁶ Seek the LORD while He may be found, Call upon Him while He is near. ⁷ Let the wicked forsake his way, And the unrighteous man his thoughts; Let him return to the LORD, And He will have mercy on him; And to our God, For He will abundantly pardon.

Ezekiel 33:7-11

⁷ "So you, son of man: I have made you a watchman for the house of Israel; therefore you shall hear a word from My mouth and warn them for Me.⁸ When I say to the wicked, 'O wicked man, you shall surely die!' and you do not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood I will require at your hand.
